



New Admission Criteria
Associate of Science in Nursing

Admission

Students seeking admission to the Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) Program must be fully admitted to the college for Spring Semester 2013 and have all transfer credit entered into the college's Banner system by **Thursday, May 23, 2013**. To take pre-admission general education courses, students should enroll in the college's *Healthcare Science Certificate*. Admission into the ASN Program is limited and is based on the following criteria and published deadline dates.

The admission criteria consist of **Admission Points with a total value of 325 points**. See the **ASN Admission Points Criteria sheet for additional information**.

Total point value will be considered for the following required criteria:

<u>Pre-admission General Education Courses</u>	maximum 50 points
<u>BIOL Courses</u>	maximum 100 points
<u>TEAS score</u>	maximum 100 points
<u>Application</u>	no points
<u>Interview (if selected)</u>	maximum 50 points

Additional points can be earned for the following optional criteria:

<u>Documented work experiences</u>	25 points
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Pre-Admission General Education Course Work

All students who want to apply to the Associate of Science in Nursing Degree Program beginning in fall semester 2013 must do the following:

Take or have transfer credit for the following pre-admission general education courses by **Thursday, May 23, 2013**.

***BIOL courses will be counted twice in the point calculation.**

Students must achieve a grade of C or higher in all pre-admission coursework. Only the highest grade for all attempts in the non-science pre-requisite courses will be considered when calculating the GPA.

If a student has taken a science (BIOL) class **more** than *once*, the college will average the first two attempts when computing the GPA. Within these first two attempts, the college will use all letter grades (A, B, C, D, F) when calculating the BIOL grade point average for the admission points criteria.

General Education Courses

The following courses may be taken while a student is enrolled in the *Healthcare Science Certificate* program or after a student is admitted into the ASN program. A student **may** take *all* general education core classes prior to admission into the program. If a student does elect to take all of these classes *prior* to admission, the student will **not** be considered full-time while taking the nursing courses. All core classes **must** be completed by the end of the fourth (4th) semester of the nursing program with a grade of “C” or higher.

TEAS

Take the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) Version 5.0 by **Thursday, May 23, 2013**. Students must achieve the minimum published national average composite score for ASN (ADN) level students on the TEAS.

A student may only take the TEAS two (2) times in a calendar year and must wait a minimum of 30 calendar days in between attempts. A TEAS score is valid for five years and CTC will use the highest score.

A study guide and practice test can be purchased at www.atitesting.com. The TEAS is available through the Chattahoochee Technical College’s Continuing Education Department. To register, visit the TEAS/HOBET page on the CTC website: www.chattahoocheetech.edu/coned/teas. If the TEAS were taken at another college, the report **must** be sent from ATI to Chattahoochee Technical College.

Interview

Students will be selected for an interview based on their total points in all other categories. Once selected, students will be notified of dates and times for the interview.

Documented Work Experiences

Experience as a patient care provider such as a CNA, EMT, Medical Assistant, Medic or LPN will suffice as work experience. Documentation will be provided on official letterhead and must have an original signature. Documentation must be submitted with the Application. Official government documents are acceptable.

Application

Students must submit a completed application in person or by US mail to the ASN Program Office at the Austell Campus. The application may **not** be emailed or faxed. **The application must be received on or before Thursday, May 23, 2013 by 2:00pm. No late applications will be accepted.** Program applications are available on the college's web site on the ASN web page. Completed applications should be mailed or delivered to the Austell Campus See address below. Faxes will not be accepted.
